## Spiritual Communion



### Why St Catherine is Amazing






St Catherine was born in the year 1347, a year before the Black Plague swept through Europe. It was a time of extreme suffering, fear and unrest. Her family lived in the Italian city of Siena and her father had a good business as a wool-dyer.

As a child *Caterina* was well-loved, both by her large family (she had more than 20 siblings!) and by her friends, among whom she was a natural leader. Early on she displayed a unique attraction to prayer and a deep understanding of the things of God. As a teenager she rejected her family's efforts to make her marry and instead retreated into a life of deep solitude and prayer with God. After three years living she emerged to serve the poor, the sick, and to guide many who came to share her work. Catherine joined a group of women attached to the Dominican Order and went on to instruct and admonish even the most powerful of princes, popes, and rulers. Catherine was tremendously brave and in her love for God and souls, she held nothing back. She died in the year 1380 in Rome, and her feast is celebrated on April 29.
